STEPHEN SONDHEIM (Music and Lyrics) wrote the music and lyrics for Saturday Night, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Anyone Can Whistle, Company, Follies, A Little Night Music, The Frogs, Pacific Overtures, Sweeney Todd, Merrily We Roll Along, Sunday in the Park with George, Into the Woods, Assassins, and Passion as well as the lyrics for West Side Story, Gypsy and Do I Hear A Waltz? For films, he composed music for *Stavisky* and songs for *Reds* and Dick Tracy. He has been awarded eight Tonys, the Pulitzer Prize, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Kennedy Center Honors and an Academy Award. His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: Finishing the Hat and Look, I Made A Hat. In 2010 the Broadway theater formerly known as Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed in his honor.







ON ASSASSINS

Playwrights Horizons opened Assassins in December of 1990, directed by Jerry Zaks. America, having just fully embraced the Gulf War, was experiencing a hyper patriotic political atmosphere. While the production team planned for a transfer to Broadway, it didn't get the chance. The timing of the Gulf War and a story about the assassinations of American leaders did not sit well with the general public and the show closed without a transfer.

Ten years later, in September 2001, Roundabout Theatre Company was preparing to open the first Broadway production of *Assassins*. After the devastating terrorist attack that struck New York City on September 11, the production was put on hold. It wasn't until 2004 that *Assassins* would finally open at Roundabout's Studio 54, directed by Joe Mantello.

The show received high praise from audiences and the media. Ben Brantley, critic for *The New York Times* wrote "...let it be stated that *Assassins* does not celebrate its homicidal subjects. Mr. Sondheim and Mr. Weidman are simply posing a question that arises in many people's minds when they read accounts of shocking, irrational crimes: 'Why would someone do that?'"

DID YOU KNOW

1863

John Wilkes Booth, a beloved theater actor in his time, was most famous for his work in Richard III. The New York Herald called him a "veritable sensation." Lincoln saw this performance two years before his assassination.

1881

At first, President James Garfield survived his gunshot wound. However, over the next few days, thirteen different doctors all used their bare, unwashed hands in surgery as each one tried to locate the bullet, accidently giving the President sepsis. In court, Charles Guiteau declared, "The doctors killed Garfield, I just shot him."

1912

John Schrank shot former president Theodore Roosevelt. The bullet was slowed down by a fifty-page speech sitting in Roosevelt's jacket pocket. Roosevelt still gave the nearly ninetyminute speech before going to the hospital. The first line of this speech became instantly prominent; "Friends, I shall ask you to be as quiet as possible. I don't know whether you fully understand that I have just been shot; but it takes more than that to kill a Bull Moose." During rehearsals at Playwrights Horizons, Schrank was played by Christopher Durang but the role was ultimately cut.

1973

The day Samuel Byck tried to hijack a commercial aircraft and fly it into the White House, President Nixon was not home.

1975

Sara Jane Moore and Lynnette "Squeaky" Fromme's attempts to assassinate Gerald Ford would make them the only two women known to have attempted the assassination of an American President. (And their attempts were only two weeks apart.) In 2006, after Moore's release from prison, she stated she was ultimately glad she was unsuccessful.

2018

Cesar Sayoc, a Floridian, created a twoweek crisis when he mailed sixteen packages of pipe bombs stuffed with fireworks powder and broken glass to over two dozen Democratic figures, including President Barack Obama, former President Clinton, Secretary Clinton, and then Vice President Joe Biden. The packages were all intercepted

prior to delivery.

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
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






JOHN DOYLE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S CIRCLE

Members of The John Doyle Artistic Director's Circle are acknowledged with a place for their name on the doors to our theater, designed by David Rockwell.



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


